The 11th East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress will be hosted by Province of West Java and will be held in Bandung as the Capital of West Java Province from 4th -6th of November 2020.

Province of West Java has 49 million people and contributes to approximately 13% of domestic GDP, and it gives a strong presence

for Indonesia. Province of West Java was created when God was smiling, which is a famous quote from MAW Brouwer. This is one illustration for the irresistible beauty of West Java that gives abundant natural resources, very beautiful locations suitable for ecotourism, and a lot of cultural inheritances.

Province of West Java is known as famous coffee production area and we are working on a new concept of "coffee diplomacy." Province of West Java is an important base of education and holds as the biggest Muslim society in Indonesia. Furthermore, Province of West Java is a place of very high historical value as the venue of the Asian-African Conference.

East Asia has a large number of important problems, such as impacts of advancement of ICT and AI on employment, the balance between technological innovation and regulations, food safety, and climate change. At the 11th East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress, I would like to hold discussions about leading solutions for these problems with you.

I hope we can strengthen and further develop the mutual relations between Province of West Java and the other local and regional governments together.

> Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) on holding the 11th East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress between Nara Prefecture, Japan and West Java Province, Republic of Indonesia

Nara Prefecture, Japan as the secretariat of the East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress and West Java Province, Republic of Indonesia as the government member of the congress have conducted frequent friendly discussions regarding hosting the 11th East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress by West Java Province. Based on previous discussions, the place and date of the 11th East Asia Local and Regional Government Congress have been decided by the Charter Governments' approval, pursuant to Article 8.3.3 and Article 8.7 of the Charter. The details are as follows.

Place: Bandung City, West Java Province, Republic of Indonesia

Date: From November 4th, 2020 to November 6th, 2020

Nara Prefecture and West Java Province will cooperate concurrently to conduct the 11th congress in the future. We, the undersigned have read and agreed with this Memorandum of Agreement.

This memorandum is drawn up in Japanese, Indonesian, and English as authentic copies. Having signed them by its respective representatives, each party will hold on to one copy of each text. This memorandum will become effective from the date of signing.

開催日:2020年11月4日~6日



Lecturer's Comments



MOTANI, Kosuke

Chief Senior Economist, the Japan Research Institute, Ltd.

I discussed tourism promotion with participants from Japan, China, Korea, Melaka State (Malaysia), and Province of West Java (Indonesia).

We can only know the realities of tourism from local and regional government staff. In that sense, this congress gave us a valuable opportunity to confirm again that staff on the front line are working with the same awareness of problems.

During the 10-year period since this congress started, Japan changed from a country with a small number of inbound foreign tourists to one with a large number of them. By talking with people from other countries, I think I could

reconfirm the situation of Japan which I could hardly notice in Japan.

While Nara Prefecture is a major tourism prefecture, its number of Japanese hotel guests is the lowest in the country. On the other hand, however, the number of foreign hotel guests is considerably increasing. This is a result of eager efforts of the prefecture, and it can be said that the appeals of Nara are more appreciated by foreigners than by the Japanese. In Nara Prefecture, which has challenges in tourism, the holding of this kind of congress itself also brought a great discovery for the people of Nara. Through not only discussion but also the excursion and other various interaction events, this congress gave a valuable opportunity for the people of Nara to recognize the appeals of the prefecture again.

The next congress will be held in Province of West Java. I expect even more people to intentionally promote tourism interaction with the world based on the valuable experience gained in Nara.



MIYAMOTO, Taro

Faculty of Law Professor at Chuo University, Professor Emeritus at Hokkaido University

International relations in East Asia take on an entirely different aspect from a political perspective focusing on central governments than from that of welfare/medical treatment focusing on local and regional governments. From the latter perspective, countries in East Asia are facing the same problems and can be said to be a community of problem.

Compared to European countries, countries in East Asia are experiencing aging at an extremely rapid speed. I think the theme common in today's discussion

was how to increase healthy population across generations, in a situation where working generations cannot support the elderly due to changes in employment structure, and so on.

To solve that problem, it is necessary for local and regional governments to take initiatives. While it is the role of the central government to protect the people who are really considered to be the social weak, the welfare to make all people healthy beyond such distinction should be advanced by local and regional governments through service benefits.

Today, we had discussion over promotion of health, community-based welfare, use of IT and AI, securement of nursing human resources, and so on, and the problems and approaches of the participating local and regional governments had so much in common. I had a stronger thought that, in order to solve problems in common, we should give ideas to each other, compete in that respect, and aim to stabilize and grow East Asia.



Speaker's Comments



TANINO, Sakutaro

Advisor of the Japan and China Friendship Center, Former Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan to China

This congress was wonderful and very enlightening for me. I learned the efforts of local and regional governments based on their respective localities on two themes, tourism promotion and welfare/medical treatment. They made me think about the roles of central governments and those of local and regional governments.

Roles of central governments include diplomacy, national defense, collection and distribution of national taxes, matters concerning human rights, care for

the weak, working hours, and formulation of laws related to the above matters. On the other hand, I think they should not stunt the hard efforts by local and regional governments based on their respective localities. Rather, I think the role of the central government is to encourage them and sometimes grant necessary subsidies.

At present, relations among East Asian countries, particularly Japan-Korea relations are in a very difficult situation, but I hope something like the Elysee Treaty concluded between French and Germany, or its strengthened version, the Aachen Treaty will come into being among Japan, China and Korea. I have a dream, what if, in the near future, not in Tokyo, but in Nara that once had wealthy interaction with East Asia, the leaders of the three countries conclude a treaty and take a ceremonial photograph, let's say, against a backdrop of the Hall of the Great Buddha (An Indian monk who lived in China organized a lavish consecration ceremony.)?
